Course Loads - 30 Hours per year/120 Hours total

What happens if I go over 30 hours?

Tuition/Textbooks/Fees



*Student/family **financially responsible** for tuition, textbooks, and fees *Student/family works directly with the college for payments *Student can choose to earn both college/HS credit -or- **only** college credit *Must be elected **ahead of registration** *Credit award **must be shared** with HS and college

*Most common option - "**default**" *All tuition/textbooks/fees **paid for** by the District and the state of Ohio *Students earn **both** HS and college credit

*Combination of both Option A/Option B: student must inform the HS and college of which option *final day to change options is on/before no fault withdrawal date





Underperforming Student Rule

CCP Probation

Earn less than a cumulative 2.0 GPA in CCP courses, or

Withdraw from 2 or more courses in one academic term

consequences

1. Student may only enroll in one CCP course for one college term

- 2. Student may not enroll in a college course in the same subject in which the student earned a D, F, NC grade (or equivalent)
- 3. If students on CCP Probation do not increase their CCP GPA to a 2.0 or above during the probation term, they will be placed on CCP Dismissal



Underperforming Student Rule

CCP Dismissal

Grade not raised during probation

May not enroll in any future CCP courses

May request an appeal to be reinstated

*Grades are still included on the transcript




Athletic Eligibility

Students must remain eligible in accordance with the OHSASA bylaws, which require students to be passing five, one credit high school courses, or the equivalent per grading period, with the high school and college courses combined. Most CCP courses taken during a semester will equal one Carnegie unit (one high school credit), allowing students the opportunity to earn more than the required fi e for athletic eligibility. It is the student's responsibility to arrange a method for obtaining a progress rep[ort as needed wsiht the college faculty in order to determine eligibility.

*Summer courses do not count toward eligibility calculations.
